Brief History of D14 Involvement

- In 2019 the D14 ST and TF program totally re-structured.
- In 2021 the Fire Mob. Plan was rewritten to modernize the response and address issues for improvement.
- New response inventories were created and ongoing work on response run cards continue.
- D14 created a definitive standardized plan for Task Force Activation.



PART I: District 14 Control Point

- District 14 Control was assumed by the Holbrook Regional Emergency Communications Center on April 7, 2025
- Please ensure your local dispatch centers use the radio as their primary point of contact with HRECC.
- In April 2025 email notifications went out to announce this change and the new telephone number is:

**NEW NUMBER FOR D14
CONTROL (781) 767-6820.**



Summary of April 2025 notice re: District 14 Control Point

- D14 needs to be notified via radio for any WF, multiple alarm, or significant event.
- HRECC/D14 can assist with your dispatchers filling out the run cards for your working fire and 2nd alarm if you would like them to. All you need to do is contact them via the radio.
- **If you want them to fill your run cards:** Have your dispatcher call D14 Control via radio and tell them your Town, the WF/2nd alarm status, and what district/run card to work off. ...”District 14, for the Town of Sudbury fill the working fire assignment for District 81 for 266 North Road. Structure Fire”.
- **If you want to have your own dispatchers handle Working Fire and 2nd alarms:** ...”District 14 for the City of Framingham, Notification only. Framingham has a working fire 15 Edmands Road.” FFD Fire alarm would dispatch their own response and cover the stations. The only two things D14 will do is send a page out to all the Chiefs to notify them of the fire and will make a general announcement on the radio; just like what is done now.
- At 3rd alarm, D14 Control should be contacted to manage your run card assignments.

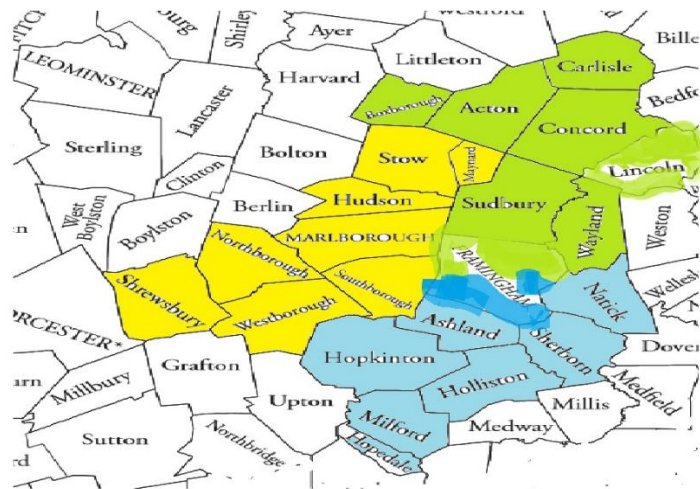
D14 REGIONAL RESOURCES Intra-District Strike Teams and Intra-District Task Forces

- District/Regional assets are called in for **“the big one”** when run cards are stressed or specialized resources are needed.
- No specialized process or permissions are needed to activate the District ST/TF’s.
- The Incident Commander will make the request thru the D14 Control Point.
- Ideally, for advanced notices, the request for D14 Strike Team activations will be done via the D14 radio system.
- Supplemental contact may be given via telephone.



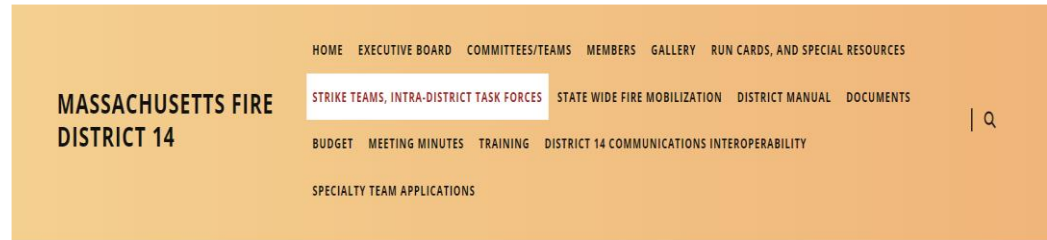
D14 Strike Team Purpose

- To establish an organized system capable of quickly deploying resources to emergency situations in a structured manner within D14.
- Formatted to provide an “All Hazards” response capability.



Intra-District Responses

- Performed via “D14 Strike Teams.”
- Specialized Intra-District Task Forces also have been created.
- Used in conjunction with FD run cards.
- Typically utilized before Statewide Mobilization is activated.

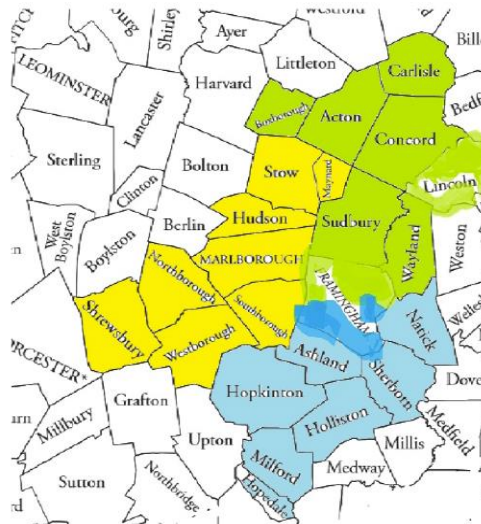

Intra-District Responses

- IC notifies the D14 Control Point requesting “Strike team” activation.
- IC assigns staging area.
- D14 Control Point makes announcement over D14 radio and begins call out of resources.
- Resources respond to Staging Area.
- At staging area the ST Leader grab the accountability tags and then will have crews complete their manifests.
- ST Leader will work with IC for assignments.

History of the Fire Mobilization Plan

- Established in the early 1950's by Governor Foster Furcolo.
- Established as a result of large scale forest fires.
- Statutory authority was contained in chapter 639 (State Civil Defense Statute) of the acts of 1950, which made the Governor responsible for protection of life and property from all natural and man made disasters.
- The original Plan split the state into four areas containing a total of 14 Fire Districts.
- Each District had fire battalions to supply mutual aid for large scale fires and disasters.
- Over the years the Plan became outdated and did not reflect today's equipment, communications and organization.



Establishment of Fire Districts

EXECUTIVE ORDER

No. 37: Establishing 14 fire mobilization districts and Civil Defense fire fighting system

DATE: 12/08/1960

ISSUER: Foster Furcolo

EXECUTIVE ORDER

No. 221: Fire mobilization districts

DATE: 06/30/1982

ISSUER: Edward J. King



E.O. 221

- Original D14 was 18 communities.
- E.O 221 modified to make changes without legislative approval
- D14 became 23 communities over time.
- Civil Defense (now MEMA) delegated as the lead state agency.
- “...appointed by the State Director of Civil Defense upon recommendation of the Heads of Fire Departments from among the Heads of the Fire Departments...”
- In plain English, the state chair, representatives of each region and district recommend names via FCAM to MEMA Director who appoints such member to the position on Fire Mob.
- As part of this order the MEMA Director is “authorized upon the recommendations of the Heads of Fire Departments within the district to designate within each fire mobilization district a fire mobilization control center..”



History of the Fire Mobilization Plan

- In 1980 the Fire Chiefs Association of Massachusetts activated a group called the State Fire Mobilization Committee to review the Executive Order and the Plan.
- Resulted in a new Executive Order #221 in 1982
- Seven key points came out of the review back in 1982.



The Seven (7) Key Points From the Review

1. It is the responsibility of the Fire Chiefs Association of Massachusetts to set up and maintain a workable plan.
2. 15 Fire Districts are formed.
3. District Fire Coordinators are appointed by the State Director of the Emergency Management Agency upon the recommendation of Fire Chiefs from within that District. These Coordinators are responsible for updating and administering the provisions of the Executive Order.



The Seven (7) Key Points From the Review

4. Regional Fire Coordinators are selected in the same manner and have overall coordinating responsibility for the Districts in their Region.

5. The Order requires that the command of the fire forces remain with the head of the fire dept. in the jurisdiction requesting assistance.

6. The Order requires that all communities retain a reasonable level of fire protection for their own coverage.

7. The Order permits training exercises and authorizes the State to provide communications equipment for the Plan.



Strike Team and Task Force Management

District Coordinator

- District Coordinators are responsible for the administration and implementation of the Statewide Fire Mobilization Plan within the District.
- District Coordinators coordinate with MEMA and TFL's for outgoing responses.

Strike Team/Task Force Leaders

- Each activation will be under the direction of two Chief Officers.
- The Leader of the activation is responsible for the deployment and operations of the Strike Team/Task Force.
- The Asst. Leader of the activation will be responsible for Accountability and Safety of the resources.



Activations within D14

- After D14 resources used, the local IC will work with TF Coord. at district and regional level to begin activation process.
- Call-up is pre-determined.
- Call-up is done by MEMA.
- The IC needs to forecast resources to address reflex times.
- Closest response is typically 1 hour away from arrival into the District.

- Notifications
- Radio Communications

Notifications

- Incoming District Coord. works with IC and Planning Section to define needs.
- Activation can be immediate or a different operational period.
- The benchmark from time of request approval to confirmation of TF resource availability is 15 minutes.
- Shift Commanders need to be empowered to make a decision of available or unavailable.
- You don't want to be "that department".



Activation

- D14 Control will send an Alert Announcement over the D14 radio system for all Dept. to standby for call-out for activation of the Fire/EMS Mobilization activation. EXAMPLE: District 14 Control to all D14 Departments. Standby for activation of Ambulance Task Force 14 B. Activation call out in 5 minutes.
- TF Chiefs will be notified via cell phones from D14 Control/Coord. with pertinent information.
- From the plan, a pre-determined assembly point will be chosen by Coord. or TF Leader.
- D14 Control will call for availability of resources. If resource is unavailable or uncertain, skip and go with an alternate.
- Once completed D14 will announce on D14 radio:
 - Leaders and assigned apparatus
 - Assembly point
 - All radio communications to assembly point will be on D14 channel
 - Once at assembly point switch all radios to D14 RED.
 - (Notify MEMA of completion of call-out.)



Radio Communications

- Car 14 will be activated for all Fire Mob. call outs.
- Members should know how to change zones on radio and be aware of channel assignments.
- MA Tactical Plan should be in all radios.
- To eliminate uncertainty and clearly define roles, Chief's radio ID is functional assignment.*
- Apparatus radio signs will be formatted with Town and Apparatus.
 - Ex. Framingham Tower 1

7. PRE-PLANNED ASSEMBLY POINTS

1. CONCORD: Concord Carlisle High School- 500 Walden Street
2. WAYLAND: Wayland Town Hall- 41 Cochituate Road
3. NATICK/FRAMINGHAM: Natick Mall- AMC Theater 16 Flutie Pass Framingham
4. ACTON: Acton Boxborough High School 36 Charter Road
5. MARLBOROUGH: Solomon Pond Mall Shopping Center 627 Donald Lynch Blvd.
6. MILFORD: Lowe's Shopping Plaza 99 Cedar St.

- Sites chosen based on ability to get to major highways.
- Sites are also landmarks and are in locations that other lots could be available.
- Chief of community NEEDS to be made aware that a site is being used in their community.



Assembly Point

- Location where all apparatus will meet with the Leaders to fill out forms and get briefing.
- Upon arrival at Point, Leader will provide Company Officer with Manifest and 214 Form and CO provide the Leader with Accountability Tags.
- Upon manifest completion, the TFL will hold a briefing on the current phase of the action plan.



Manifests

- Manifests will be filled out by officers of each piece of apparatus.
- Information consists of the unit, the units specifics such as tank size/pump gpm, names of crew members, and other pertinent information of the resources.
- Once manifests are completed, one copy stays with Leader and the other will be brought to CP by District Coordinator.
- The manifests are put together and an IAP will be created where the resources will be used.

Convoy

- TFL will be the lead vehicle, followed by the larger/slower apparatus.
- Safety/Acct. Chief will take the last position.
- Cell phones will be essential.
- D14 Red will be used as communication channel.
- District Coord. will proceed ahead of TF with manifests to meet up at CP to help develop action plan with D14 resources.
- Car 14 will also go ahead to address traffic problems and will report to Staging to meet with TFL.



Logistical Concerns

- TF/ST activation should be considered as mutual aid.
- Vehicles should be fueled prior to deployment to Assembly Point.
- Spare portable batteries and phone chargers should be brought.
- Non-deployed Chiefs should check-in with D14 Control to provide coverage for areas where Chiefs were deployed.

On Scene

- Orders for TF will come down from IC.
- TFL is in command of TF and will handle all operational tasks and needs.
- ATFL will be Safety/Accountability.
- Communications will be critical.
- Work safely.



Demobilization

- Companies will not be released until approved by the TF-ST Leader.
- At Demob. the Leader will receive the 214 form from the Officer and return the Accountability tag.
- Leader will inform D14 Control of apparatus release and apparatus will contact D14 when back in their respective town.



Post Mobilization

- After the incident the TFL/STL will need to write an operational report.
- Information of this report will come from the 214's of each company.
- PDF fillable form is available on website.
- This form, the 214's, and the Coordinator's report will need to be submitted to Fire Mob. Regional Coord. who will send to State Chair.



SUMMARY- Activations

- Regional assets are defined in the D14 Intra-District Strike Team and Task Forces.
- Intra-District resources will report directly to staging and await orders from IC or designee.
- The Statewide Mobilization Plan only comes into effect when the local community resources and those of regional mutual aid have been expended.
